CELEBRATE LEARNING!

On May 30th, we hosted our annual Celebration of Learning event. We had a few goals in mind as a staff when we designed this event. First, we recognized that we have many opportunities for our community to see extracurricular events, but not a lot of opportunity to see the academic work that our students are doing. Second, we wanted to give students an authentic audience to view their work. Often it is just their teachers that see their work and we thought that an audience of adults adds motivation and authenticity to their work. Third, we wanted to give students an opportunity for meta-cognition - which is to say an opportunity for them to think about how

and why they do learning. We believe that it's important for students to understand the process of their learning and the reason for their learning.

As we worked through the stages of preparing for the Celebration of Learning, we saw that our students are getting it. They are children who are beginning to think about their work by answering such questions as:

"what was most challenging about this?", "why did I enjoy this?", "what did I learn about God and His creation through this learning task?", etc. It was exciting to see that they are beginning to understand themselves as learners who are involved in a process, not simply receptacles of skills and knowledge. Being a community of learners means that we are all learners involved in the process of learning that our students are undertaking. It should be assumed that we will learn something as the students share their learning, as opposed to assuming that we as adults have learned it all. We are here as a whole community to learn together and to come closer to God through the process.
