HOW WE CAN CREATE A WORLD OF KINDNESS

What does it mean to be kind? Colossians 3:12 begins with the command to God's chosen people to clothe themselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. I believe that the Apostle Paul chose these words with intention. As Mrs. Beerda pointed out to us this week, he didn't command us to be nice. In fact, the word 'kind' or 'kindness' is used myriad times in the Bible, but 'nice' is not used. So, what's the difference between being kind and being nice?

Look up a few definitions of 'nice' and you get synonyms like 'agreeable', 'pleasant', and 'satisfactory.' These

seem more like the characteristics of good citizens, but I can't help but think that God calls us as His Chosen People to do and be more. Take a look at some synonyms for 'kind' and you see words like 'charitable', 'considerate', and 'compassionate.' Yes, we're called to be good citizens, to be well-mannered, and to be nice. But we're definitely called to more. In the Bible, we're called to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice (Romans 12:1), love our enemies (Matthew 5:34), consider others greater than ourselves (Philippians 2:3), etc. We were also challenged this week to acknowledge that kindness begets kindness. As we endeavour to be Christ's hands and feet to the world, it will be our kindness that says the most about who it is that lives in us and perhaps inspire others to kindness as well.

At the meeting, updates will be shared about the school's finances from the past year, our Principal Paul Marcus will give a presentation on the school's new 'Learning Flow', and Ms. Shannon Marcus, principal at Durham Christian High School, will provide us with an update about the exciting things happening at the Christian secondary school level.

At our monthly meetings we've been spending a lot of time thinking about the future. As our school has grown, we have had to begin analyzing what lies ahead. How do we want to use the facilities that God has given us? What direction do we want to go in our instruction and programming? How do we want to utilize the incredible gifts and talents we have on staff?
